

Billings County Keeps Citizens Safe and Informed with Everbridge Resident Alerts


Billings County is now working with Everbridge, the worldwide leader in unified critical communications, to keep residents, staff and emergency personnel safe and informed with quick and reliable emergency notifications and public service announcements. The county will begin using Everbridge Resident Alerts to communicate with citizens and businesses during emergencies and other critical events. Residents listed in the county 911 database will be automatically subscribed to alerts by phone. In order to receive alerts on cellular devices, please contact the 911 coordinator at 701-623-4810.

Notifications may include:

- Flood Hazards
- Road Closures
- Amber Alerts
- Shelter in Place
- Hazmat Incidents

Messages will come directly from Billings County emergency personnel or state radio dispatchers.

The service is provided by your monthly \$1.00 911 service surcharge on your telephone bill.



NOTIFICATION SYSTEM INSTRUCTIONS

In emergency situations, you may receive a voice notification sent to your telephone. Each message will have an introduction, main content and a confirmation component.

PLEASE DO NOT HANG UP DURING THE INTRODUCTION. The notification is a pre-recorded message from Billings County or State Radio Dispatchers.

Once the introduction is complete, please follow the instructions to confirm receipt of a message.

TELEPHONE/VOICE

1. You must press "1" after the system greeting to hear the message.
2. The main content of the communications will follow.
3. To confirm receipt of the message, Press "1" a final time.
