

**BILLINGS COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING –OCTOBER 2, 2012**

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M. with Commissioners Arthaud, Kasian and Thompson in attendance.

Kasian moved to approve the minutes from the September 4, 2012 regular meeting. Thompson seconded. All voted aye.

Donna Adams presented the board with the delegate materials for the North Dakota Association of Counties annual meeting. Donna also asked the board to transfer the Superintendent of Schools duties to her from the Auditor's Office. The board will take it under consideration and let her know.

Pat Weir stopped in to inquire about the River Drive road because it's starting to cave in. Commissioner Arthaud said that the county will be working on the road shortly and that will be fixed.

Roy Krivoruchka and Jim Haag attended the meeting to discuss the possibility of purchasing gravel from Norm Winter. Norm owns the mineral rights, but it's a different surface owner. The board requested that they have State's Attorney Brovold check the legalities.

The board reviewed a raffle permit submitted by Missi Baranko for the Jason Downing Medical Benefit. Thompson moved to approve the permit. Kasian seconded. All voted aye.

The board reviewed the following zoning items from the zoning board's September 20, 2012 meeting.

Doug Tescher: Conditional use permit to mine scoria on 5 acres in the NE1/4 Section 6-139-102. Property is zoned agricultural. The zoning board approved the permit. Thompson moved to uphold the zoning board recommendation. Kasian seconded. All voted aye.

Billings County District 2: Conditional use permit to mine gravel on 10 acres in the SW1/4 of Section 14-142-98. Property is zoned agricultural and owned by Wayne Hecker, et al. The zoning board approved the permit. Thompson moved to uphold the zoning board recommendation. Kasian seconded. All voted aye.

Rick & Kay Baranko: Conditional use permit to build a 54' x 140' shop with living quarters on a 5 acre tract in the NW1/4 Section 36-141-99. Property is zoned agricultural. Approval from SWDH for the sewer has not yet been obtained. The zoning board approved the application pending approval from SWDH for the sewer. Thompson moved to uphold the zoning board recommendation. Kasian seconded. All voted aye.

Patrick Marx: Application to rezone approximately 40 acres in the SW1/4 15-143-99 from agricultural to industrial. Also proposed is a conditional use permit for a drilling mud recycling plant operated by R360. Patrick has received approval from the DOT for widening the intersection and approval from the State Health

Department. The zoning board approved the application and conditional use permit. Thompson moved to uphold the zoning board recommendation. Kasian seconded. All voted aye.

Stacey presented the board with the amendments to the zoning ordinance that were approved by the zoning board. Thompson moved to adopt the amendments. Kasian seconded. All voted aye. The amendment is as follows:

AMENDMENT TO BILLINGS COUNTY ZONING RESOLUTION NO. 1

6.14 Recreational Vehicles as Temporary Housing

6.14.1

A Recreational Vehicle ("RV") may be used as a temporary residence:

- 1) If located in a licensed Recreational Vehicle Park pursuant to Section 5.3.2(a) of the Billings County Zoning Ordinance, NDCC Chapter 23-10, and NDAC Chapter 33-33-02; or
- 2) As a Conditional Use in a Residential District pursuant to Section 5.2.2(f) of the Billings County Zoning Ordinance; or
- 3) If the conditions outlined in this section are met.

6.14.2 Conditional Use Permit

The issuance of the Conditional Use Permit is subject to the procedures contained within Section 7.3 of the Billings County Zoning Ordinance.

6.14.3 Criteria for a Conditional Use Permit

- 1) Up to two (2) RV's may be located on a property with a permanent occupied dwelling.
- 2) The owner of the property must occupy the main dwelling on the property.
- 3) The RV(s) must be connected to a utility pole and connected to a septic system (with approval from the Southwest District Health Unit), and water must be supplied by a potable water source.
- 4) The RV(s) must be located a minimum of 20 feet from all other structures on the property and must meet the required setbacks from property lines, section lines, roads, and highways for the district in which it is located.
- 5) The RV(s) may not be used as a rental property, the intent of this section being only to allow occupancy of an RV as a residence where necessitated by financial hardship, and the charging of rent to the occupant(s) being inconsistent with this purpose.
- 6) The RV(s) must be spaced to adequately accommodate emergency services.
- 7) An occupancy list to be maintained and provided to the county 911 emergency coordinator on a current basis.

6.14.4 Allowable Districts

A permit may be granted in a Residential District or in an Agricultural District only if the property has a minimum of five (5) acres.

6.13.5 Termination of Conditional Use Permit

A Conditional Use Permit granted in accordance with this section is subject to review by the Planning and Zoning Board at any time. The permit may be revoked, pursuant to Section 7.3 of the Billings County Zoning Ordinance, by the County Commission anytime the applicant is in non-compliance with any of the conditions set by the Planning and Zoning Board or the County Commission for the issuance of the permit.

6.13.6 Renewal of Conditional Use Permit

Any Conditional Use Permit granted in accordance with this section shall expire one year from the date of issuance. The permit may be extended by the Planning and Zoning Board upon written application of the owner of the property or authorized representative provided that the extension is for the same use as specified in the original permit and that the applicant is in compliance with the terms and conditions specified in the original permit.

6.14.7 Exception

The requirements of this Section 6.14 do not apply if the RV is occupied for less than thirty (30) total days in a 12-month period.

Craig Kubas and Dave Gates with Kadrmas, Lee, & Jackson met with the board for the monthly engineer's report.

The board recessed from 12 Noon to 1:00 P.M.

Pat Rummel and Dave Jurgens met with the board to discuss a grant for the Sheriff's Department for overtime for safety patrols. They also discussed the burn ban and until it's taken off, there is absolutely no burning in the county by anybody. With the increase in calls for the Sheriff's Office, Pat stated that he is getting behind with the DEM duties. Pat informed the board that he will be having another Emergency Manager help with the paperwork. Brenda Friez in Golden Valley County is willing to do it on an as needed basis, and paid from a grant fund. Dickinson Police Department is requesting funding from seven counties to purchase a SWAT team vehicle, but they are waiting until the end of the year to see how the budget looks.

The 2013 budget hearing was held at 1:30 as advertised. Deb Walworth with Prairie West Development was in attendance in response to an anonymous letter received concerning the funding Billings County provides them. Two signed letters in support of the funding were also received. The board indicated that they were in support of what is being done and that the funding provided is not from taxes, but from oil and gas production revenue. The board informed Donna Adams that the Superintendent of Schools Designee duties were going to remain in the Auditor's Office. No other citizens were in attendance either for or against any portion of the budget. Thompson moved to approve the 2013 budget. Kasian seconded. All voted aye.

Arthaud moved to approve the budgeted 2012 transfer of \$7,000 from Operating and Maintenance Reserve to the Extension Service. Thompson seconded. All voted aye.

**BILLINGS COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
SPECIAL MEETING –OCTOBER 29, 2012**

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 A.M. with Commissioners Kasian and Thompson in attendance. Commissioner Arthaud was absent.

Others present during portions of the meeting were: Marcia Lamb, Pat Rummel, Kari Klang, Mitch Gilseth, Steve Meier, Jay Brovold, Jason Kastrow

One bid was received for the 4-wheel drive front end loader from RDO Equipment in the amount of 221,635.00. Thompson moved to table awarding the bid until the November 8, 2012 regular meeting. Kasian seconded. All voted aye.

Pat Rummel presented the board with Resolution 2012-14 putting the burn ban back to being dependent on the fire index. The resolution reads as follows:

RESOLUTION NO: 2012-14

Fire Emergency Order

WHEREAS, the Billings County Board of County Commissioners recognizes that current conditions have created an extreme risk to the citizens and property within Billings County, ND, of unnecessary loss by fire; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to regulate activities within the County which pose a potential hazard for such loss, should the present weather conditions continue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BILLINGS COUNTY IS DECLARED UNDER A FIRE EMERGENCY ORDER AND A BURN BAN IS IN FORCE.

1. No travel is to be allowed off of surfaced roadways normally used for vehicular traffic except as necessary for normal farmer/rancher or industry operations.
2. Industrial operating crews and farmer/rancher operations shall have fire extinguishers and normal fire-fighting equipment at hand, and industrial personnel shall remain at the job site for one-half hour after daily operations are completed.
3. Smoking is restricted to inside of vehicles or buildings.
4. Burn ban to include any open burning which includes a ban on the ignition of fireworks, garbage or pit burning and campfires.
5. This burn ban is in effect for Billings County when the Fire Index is in the High, Very High or Extreme category until further notice.

Pursuant to NDCC 37-17.1-10, any person who willfully violates the burning ban established by this resolution is guilty of a Class B Misdemeanor (UP TO 30 DAYS IN JAIL AND A \$1000.00 FINE.), and restitution of fire suppression costs may be sought from the court.
